LWVCC Steering Committee Meeting

Via Zoom

15 November 2022

Attending: Rachel Avila, Sara Bresler, Kathy Cox, Cindy Hahn, Jan Koch and Sue Sargo

Call to Order: 12:00 pm by Jan Koch

Minutes: October minutes were sent with the agenda prior to the meeting. No questions or concerns were voiced. Sue Sargo made a motion to approve the minutes as submitted. Sara Bresler seconded the motion. The minutes were approved as submitted unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: **Sue** Floyd was absent. No questions or concerns **were** voiced regarding the **Treasurer's Report**. **Sue Sargo** made **a** motion to **accept** the report **as submitted**. Sara **Bresler** seconded the motion. The Treasurer's Report **was** accepted unanimously.

Committee Reports:

Membership - Rachel Avila **reported one new** member, **Susan Chyczewski**. Rachel mentioned that she **has** not received **any new PSU-**LWV **members**. **Jan** requested that she **contact** Sydney **and** Giselle regarding new members.

Voter's Guide - Sara Bresler was pleased with the CDT, Gazette and Lock Haven papers presentation. Jan Koch mentioned that the timing of the publications was excellent, with the Gazette being closer to the election. The Voter's guide in the Gazette was printed in one lot, making it easier for distribution and for voters to use.

Candidates' Night - Sue Werner was absent. Cindy Hahn discussed possible changes to the Candidate Guidelines for Candidates' Night for [ss1] discussion at the January 2023 meeting. Candidate petitions for 2023 will begin in February 2023. Municipal elections will be held in 2023 and there will be many more candidates and races on the ballot than this year. In the previous election there was interest in our including the Jury Commissioner's race. Cindy suggested the following changes: drop coverage of the row offices at Candidates' Night OR ask only the following 3 questions and allow 1 minute for each candidate to answer each question: job description/duties; candidate's qualifications; and their top priority should they win. To better allow us to decide what the cutoffs should be (by municipality size) for the Candidates' Nights and Voter's Guide, Cindy will gather information on population numbers of all municipalities and the number of seats to be filled in each municipality for the January meeting. The

matter was tabled until January.

Sara noted that the email addresses had not been included on the petitions making it difficult to reach the candidates. Sara will follow up with the Election Office to see if this can be amended. Sue Sargo will follow up with the LWVPA Voter Education committee to see if there is a state-wide fix.

Voter Education

High School - Sara Bresler reported that the SCAHS Key Club did hold a voter registration drive but there was minimal student interest. Rachel Avila suggested trying to establish a competition with Bellefonte HS or other high schools in the county for most registrations done. Sue Sargo noted the PA Governor's office already has a program like that which might be useful for the schools. Sara will investigate the suggestions with Marion Sheridan.

LWV at PSU - Jenna Lugo was absent. Laura Brown was absent but provided the following update: "Penn State has been recognized by the national ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge as a Most Engaged Campus for College Student Voting for 2022. We are among 394 colleges and universities across the U.S. who have received this recognition. I believe the responsibility for making this happen lies with LWV at Penn State. Building on the foundation established for the fall 2022 election. Hopefully, efforts to increase student-voter engagement will continue through the work of LWV at Penn State and the (soon to be established) Advisory Committee working with PSU Votes— an arm of the Center for Character, Conscience, and Public Purpose. I will be meeting with Kate Hynes (adviser to LWV at Penn State) and hope to work out goals, priorities, and next steps."

Voter Registration and Education - Sue Sargo reported that the state ACLU had requested the LWVPA to have members monitor the ballot canvass in all counties and that she had volunteered for Centre County. Canvass began 11/10 and is to continue until 11/15 when the unofficial results must be transmitted to the PA DOS. Final certification results must be transmitted to PA DOS on 11/28/22. ACLU guidelines were to monitor for disruptions from election deniers, the objection to the inclusion of ballots, and objections based on fraud. Sue reported that multiple people spoke during the public comments portion of the two meetings she attended. They reported problems in Precinct 24 which is on PSU campus at the HUB. The complaint centered on Commissioner Michael Pipe assisting voters with provisional ballots. They read multiple sections from the PA Election Code that indicated no government official could work at polling places. They requested Pipe to recuse himself. The attorney for Centre County Republicans and the PA GOP requested a full investigation. Other complaints included ballot shortages in Precinct 81, broken lock on the drop box at the HUB, voters having to vote provisionally because they were told that they had requested a mail ballot application, but the voter said they did not apply, multiple power outages causing delays and long lines. During the Hearing portion of the meeting on 11/15 regarding three ballot challenges, two cases were referred to the Centre County District Attorney for possible voter fraud.

Communication

Website - Laura Brown was absent but supplied the following: The site is now updated (post-election).

Social Media - Jan Koch reported that she had posted reminders for the public about the great voter turnout and how more votes will probably mean a longer wait for final results.

Banners - Laura Brown was absent but supplied the following: *Displays in State*College looked good. It would be good to consider adding more of the banners produced this year that have the LWVCC URL and a QR code. The Bellefonte arrangements were complicated. It never looked good because it drooped in the center, and it was unreadable. The Borough tried to rehang it and relocate it but that didn't solve the problem. We'll need to re-evaluate banners that span streets.

Cindy Hahn noted that the banners had been a subject of discussion at the Bellefonte Borough Council with a complaint that the Borough permitted a "left-leaning" organization to hang a banner.

New Business

December meeting - Jan Koch has contacted Susan Gobreski, LWVPA Director of Government but has not yet had a reply.

Jan also reported on her interview with Chris Morelli, reporter for Town & Gown. The focus was the LWVCC and the contributions we have made to our community.
